A Respectful Witness (1)

A witness is someone who tells other people what they know to be true. Sometimes a witness will be needed to decide if someone is guilty of a crime, or a news reporter might want to hear about something big that happened from a witness—someone who saw it. Lots of times in the Bible Jesus' followers are called witnesses, because we know something true about Jesus and we need to share it! But being a good witness for Jesus starts a long time *before* we begin talking...

Peter sums up his big idea in verse 12. (Can you fill in the blanks?)

Peter reminds us that followers of Jesus follow in His footsteps: so we follow His example of being sure about God's love for us (see verse 9) and being respectful and kind to others—even if they don't like us or don't act respectfully towards us (see verse 12).

Peter reminds us that Jesus dying on the cross for us is what **rescues** us and gives us hope—but it's also what **reminds** us to live for Him and put others first!
